Bendigo Bank Exhibition

As we reported in our last Newsletter, late last year an opportunity arose to assist Clovelly Bendigo Bank to install a hanging system at the Bank on Clovelly Road for art work. This occurred as planned and soon after the Bank asked RAS if we could organise some works to hang for the Xmas/New Year period. The art works would be for sale. With limited time we were able to gather together works from 16 different members. These were then installed together with catalogue listing the title of work, artist name, price. Two works were sold as a result of the Exhibition.

This process has now rolled forward a second time with 19 new art works installed for the March/April period. At the time of writing one of those new works has been sold.

Future exhibitions are planned at the Bank later in the year and members are invited to participate. Emails outlining this process will be forwarded to members.

RAS congratulates the Bank on this initiative which is consistent with its planned program of support in our local community.
